Glorious Processions: Scott Hahn Reflects on Trinity Sunday

Sunday Bible Reflections by Dr. Scott Hahn
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First Reading: Proverbs 8:22–31 | Psalms 8:4–9
Second Reading: Romans 5:1–5 | Gospel: John 16:12–15

In today's Liturgy we're swept through time in glorious procession—from before earth and sky were set in place to the coming of the Spirit upon the new creation, the Church.

We begin in the heart of the Trinity, as we listen to the testimony of Wisdom in today's First Reading. Eternally begotten, the firstborn of God, He is poured forth from of old in the loving delight of the Father.

Through Him, the heavens were established, the foundations of the earth fixed. From before the beginning, He was with the Father as His "Craftsman," the artisan by Whom all things were made. And He took special delight, He tells us, in the crowning glory of God's handiwork—the human race, the "sons of men."

In today's Psalm, He comes down from heaven, is made a little lower than the angels, comes among us as "the Son of Man" (see Hebrews 2:6–10).

All things are put under His feet so that He can restore to humanity the glory for which we were made from the beginning, the glory lost by sin. He tasted death that we might be raised to life in the Trinity, that His name might be made glorious over all the earth.

Through the Son, we have gained grace and access in the Spirit to the Father, as Paul boasts in today's Epistle (see Ephesians 2:18).

The Spirit, the Love of God, has been poured out into our hearts—a Spirit of adoption, making us children of the Father once more (see Romans 8:14–16).

This is the Spirit that Jesus promises in today's Gospel.

His Spirit comes as divine gift and anointing (see 1 John 2:27), to guide us to all truth, to show us "the things that are coming," the things that were meant to be from before all ages—that we will find peace and union in God, share the life of the Trinity, and dwell in God as He dwells in us (see John 14:23; 17:21).

THURSDAYS OF JUNE: ADORATION

During this month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, to make reparation for the many past and ongoing sins our Eucharistic Lord suffers in the Blessed Sacrament: In addition to our usual schedule, ***every Thursday throughout the month of June there will be a Holy Hour of silent adoration beginning at 8am*** followed by our usual 9am mass.

MAIN ENTRANCE OPEN

I'm happy to inform you that the second phase of work on our main entrance walkway & steps is now completed. This means that the main doors are now open for you to enter the building. Please note that the hand railings for the steps will be installed shortly.

Along with the main entrance now open again; now that the health and safety pandemic rules have been relaxed... we will also resume opening the side entrance, closest to the parking lot.

SUNDAY & HOLY DAY OBLIGATION

On Thursday the Archdiocese sent out the following message...

"End of the suspension of the Sunday Obligation:

*In 2020, at the beginning of the pandemic, Archbishop Lépine issued a dispensation from the Sunday obligation to attend Mass, as churches were closed for liturgical gatherings. When our places of worship reopened some months later, Archbishop Lépine maintained this dispensation pending further notice, in consideration of the persistently high risks involved and in response to the widespread fear of contracting the virus in a public place. Now that the public health state of emergency has been lifted in Quebec, and in order to remove all doubt in the conscience of the faithful, **please be advised that this dispensation is now cancelled.**"*

For those of you who have remained secluded due to concern about Covid, and might be worried about large gatherings; among our three Sunday masses (Saturday at 4:30pm, and Sunday at 9am & 11am) the Saturday vigil Mass at 4:30pm usually has the least amount of people, which could help alleviate your concerns.

IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY

This year the feast day for the Immaculate Heart of Mary falls on June 25th (Saturday). There will be a mass on the 25th at 9am followed by the rosary to celebrate this beautiful feast in honour of our mother's loving heart.

THE FIVE PRAYERS OF FATIMA

The Fatima Prayer/Decade Prayer

(Mary told the children that people should add this prayer to the end of each decade of the Rosary.)

“O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell, lead all souls to Heaven, especially those most in need of Thy mercy. Amen.”

The Sacrifice Prayer

(Mary gave the children this prayer, as well as the Fatima Prayer/Decade Prayer, on June 13th, 1917. The prayer is meant to be recited when you are offering up suffering to God.)

“O Jesus, it is for the love of Thee, in reparation for the offenses committed against the Immaculate Heart of Mary, and for the conversion of poor sinners [that I do this].”

The Pardon Prayer

(This prayer was given to the children by the angel that visited them in 1916, the year before Mary appeared to them.)

“My God, I believe, I adore, I hope and I love Thee! I beg pardon for all those that do not believe, do not adore, do not hope and do not love Thee.”

The Angel’s Prayer

(This is another prayer given to the children by the angel. There was a Eucharistic host and chalice suspended in the air, and the angel led them in kneeling before it and praying this prayer.)

“O Most Holy Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, I adore Thee profoundly. I offer Thee the most precious Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ present in all the tabernacles of the world, in reparation for the outrages, sacrileges and indifferences by which He is offended. By the infinite merits of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary I beg the conversion of poor sinners.”

The Eucharistic Prayer

(When Mary appeared to the children for the first time on May 13, 1917, she said, “You will have much to suffer, but the grace of God will be your comfort.” According to Lucia, a bright light shone all around them, and without thinking about it, they all started reciting this prayer.)

“Most Holy Trinity, I adore Thee! My God, my God, I love Thee in the Most Blessed Sacrament.”
